SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

4.1. Description of Necessary Measures

Eye Contact: May cause irritation, redness, pain, and tearing.

If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Wash areas of contact with soap and water for at least 15 minutes. Call a physician if irritation develops. Dilute with water or milk. Vomiting may occur spontaneously but do not induce. Call a physician immediately.

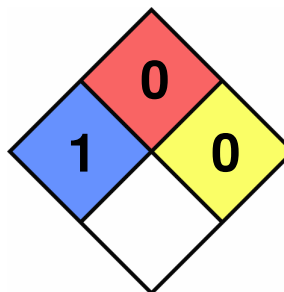
