SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

4.1. Description of Necessary Measures

- Eye Contact:** IF IN EYES: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Irritant, possibly corrosive to eye tissue. Symptoms include tearing, redness, pain, and impaired vision.

4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

Fatal in contact with skin Corrosive and toxic. May be fatal if swallowed. Do not get in eyes, on skin or clothing. If ingested, do not induce vomiting. Give large quantity of water and call a physician. Wash areas of contact with plenty of water for 15 minutes. For eyes, get medical attention. EYE CONTACT: Irritant, possibly corrosive to eye tissue. Symptoms include tearing, redness, pain, and impaired vision. SKIN CONTACT: May irritate damaged skin, absorption can occur with effects similar to those via ingestion. CHRONIC EFFECTS / CARCINOGENICITY: Chronic exposure can lead to central nervous system damage.

4.3. Immediate Medical Attention or Special Treatment Needed

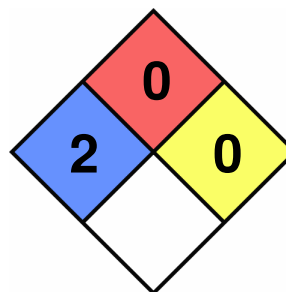
