SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures

4.1. Description of Necessary Measures

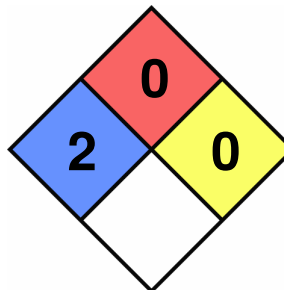
